



## Water Restrictions In Effect

As the severe drought in California and in our region continues, we must do all that we can to protect our limited water supplies. The State of California and the South Tahoe Public Utility District have adopted new restrictions to limit outdoor water use and waste.

The water restrictions and provisions of the Water Conservation Program and the California State Water Resources Control Board Emergency Water Conservation Regulation are mandatory, and are necessary to conserve our water resources. *Failure to comply may result in a fine.*

### Watering Days and Times:

Outdoor irrigation may only occur between the hours of 6pm to 6am and is limited to 20 minutes per zone per day, on your designated watering days. Drip or micro irrigation is exempt from this requirement.

### Designated Watering Days:

- Even Number Addresses: Monday, Wednesday and Friday
- Odd Number Addresses: Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday

### Water Prohibitions:

- Irrigating during or within

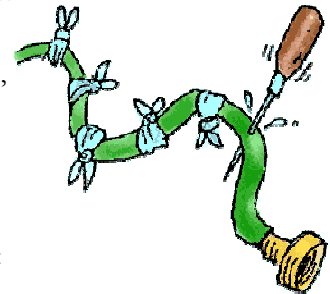
48 hours of measurable precipitation (NEW)

- Irrigating in a manner that causes runoff
- Using potable water to wash sidewalks, driveways, decks, patios or other improved areas
- Using a hose to wash a vehicle, or for any other purpose, without a shutoff nozzle
- Irrigating non-landscaped, natural vegetation or undeveloped property
- Using potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature without

a recirculating system

All water users are required to repair all leaks in plumbing and irrigation systems.

If you have an emergency, please call 530.544.6474. The

District does not charge for responding to emergency, or nonemergency service calls during regular business hours (7:30am – 5:30pm, Monday – Friday). In order to recover the additional labor, equipment, and administrative costs associated with after-hour ser-

vice calls, the District charges \$190.00, excluding holidays. The charge for responding to a service call on a legal holiday is \$240.00. Please contact the District if you need further information regarding service calls.
