ENGINEERING STAFF REPORT (as of December 7, 2022)

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

- a. Secondary Clarifier 3 Rehabilitation Project (TNT Industrial)
 - Staff is scheduled to attend mediation with TNT for grout floor failure on December 13
- b. Luther Pass Tank 2 Replacement (TNT Industrial)
 - Staff met with TNT and their subcontractor RDC on December 5 to discuss District's response to their request for relief from liquidated damages and discussed next steps
- c. Rocky 1 Waterline Replacement Project (Haen)
 - Board authorized Staff to file Notice of Completion on November 17
 - Staff is preparing Change Order for as-needed services on January 5
- d. Blower Generator, Secondary Clarifiers 1/2, and Tank Backup Power (Vinciguerra)
 - Board approved Partial Notice of Completion for Secondary Clarifiers 1&2 on November 17; Staff is preparing Partial Closeout and Change Order for Board consideration on January 5
 - Staff is preparing Partial Closeout for Blower Generator for Board consideration on December 15
 - Board approved Task Order amendment on December 1 for Carollo to prepare a package for rebid of Secondary Clarifiers 1 and 2
 - Staff is preparing Authorization to Rebid Secondary Clarifiers 1 and 2 on January 5
 - Radio Tower delivered December 2; construction will commence after December 6, weather pending
- e. Paloma Well Rehabilitation (Zim Industries)
 - Board approved Change Order #3 on December 1
- f. Tahoe Keys Pump Station Rehabilitation Project (T&S Construction)
 - Board approved Change Order #1 on November 17
- g. Bowers & Bijou 2/3 Waterline Replacement Projects (Vinciguerra)
 - Board approved final balancing Change Orders and Closeout Agreements on November 17
- h. Keller Heavenly Phases 1, 2 and 3 Project (White Rock)
 - Filing Notice of Completion was delayed by staff; staff is preparing Closeout Agreement and final balancing Change Order for Board consideration on January 5

- Contractor has reinstalled half the tank anchor chairs but is struglling with snow management; goal is to have tank tested and disinfected by end of December
- i. Tanks Touchup Project (Topline Engineers)
 - Board approved balancing Change Order on November 17
 - Board approved Notice of Completion on December 1
 - Staff is preparing Closeout Agreement for Board consideration on January 5
- j. Tallac Creek Sewer Crossing (Haen Constructors)
 - Board terminated Emergency action on November 17
 - Board approved Change Order #1 on December 1
 - Staff is preparing Notice of Completion for Board consideration on December 15
 - Staff and consultant are preparing post-construction monitoring report and revegetation mitigation plan, due to Lahontan in January
- k. Upper Truckee Pump Station (TBD)
 - Bids opened three bids on November 30
 - Staff is reviewing bids and intends to bring recommendation for award to Board on December 15

PLANNING/DESIGN

- a. Groundwater Sustainability Agency
 - Interim Groundwater Program Manager: Staff is working with Kennedy Jenks to prepare proposal for additional reporting services for Board consideration on January 5
 - Staff continues to work with Kennedy Jenks to prepare Round 2 Grant Application, due date extended to December 16
- b. Al Tahoe/Bayview Backup Power & Well Rehabilitation Project (Consultant: Kennedy Jenks)
 - Consultant is preparing Design Memo for staff review by mid-December
- c. Bijou Pump Station Project (Consultant: WSC)
 - Board approved Notice of Exemption filing on December 1
 - Consultant scheduled to deliver 90% Design by December 27, in time for State Revolving Fund (SRF) Application due date end of December.
- d. Luther Pass Tanks Rehabilitation Project (Consultant: Bayez and Patel)
 - Board approved Authorization for Bid on December 1
 - Consultant has provided draft design; staff is reviewing
 - Staff is planning to advertise for bid starting December 16
- e. Water System Asset Management Projects
 - Well Performance Monitoring: Pumps continuing with 2022 testing, completing Valhalla and Sunset in the last month
 - Staff participated in Knowledge Exchange in Denmark in November
 - Staff has focused on GIS Dashboard development over past month, with progress on cameras and plowing tools
 - In November, staff focused on compiling data on status of USFS Sewer connections
- f. General Asset Management Projects
 - SCADA Historian Upgrades (Consultant: West Yost): Board approved Task Order on November 3 for Historian Migration and Tags Cleanup
 - SCADA Historian Upgrades (Consultant: Carollo) Board approved Task Order on October 20

- a. Luther Pass Pump Replacements
 - Staff is working with Flowserve to schedule installation of Pump 1 base and pump/motor in mid- December
- b. Diamond Valley Ranch
 - Staff is preparing Task Order for Domenichelli and Associates to continue supporting irrigation system operation and reporting for 2023-2025, for Board consideration on December 15
- c. Tahoe Keys Water System
 - Consultants for Task 3 interviewed November 29; staff is making selection and preparing Task Order for District consideration in January
 - Staff will present results of Phase 1 and 2 assessment to Board on December 15
- d. Community Project Support and Interagency Coordination
 Staff is working with City on public/private partnership opportunity to bring fiber optic to
 District field stations
- e. WWTP Solar Project (Staten)
 - Staff has contracted with Old Republic to prepare a title report to confirm deed restrictions in place for property; report expected by December 9
 - Staff met with Staten team and TRPA on December 5 to discuss permitting requirements
- f. Engineering Staffing:
 - Hydrogeologist, Ivo Bergsohn, last work day is December 16.
 - Water Resources Manager and Senior/Associate Engineer currently recruiting, posting through January 8

 - Annual meetings between Engineering and individual Operations Departments concluded late November
 - Annual presentation of Engineering Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to staff is scheduled for December 21
